Even More Reminders

Break Schedules:

It's Getting Colder...

OK, all you Piano students can skip this, as you don't have to carry your instruments around with you. (good thing, right?) Guitar students – listen up!

Dry air and cold temperatures wreak havoc on wooden instruments. Don't leave your instrument in an unheated space for too long (like a car) when it is very cold outside.

Likewise, dry winter air *(made worse by heating)* can cause the wood to shrink, resulting in cracks, or glue joints failing. Please use a humidifier at home, and/or a case or instrument humidifier. These can be purchased at most shops that sell guitars and other wooden instruments.

Nylon guitar strings are also very sensitive to temperature changes and will require a lot of adjusting. Keep your guitar at a stable temperature, and tune it often during the winter months!
